While management time intensifies there are very real benefits, particularly for pastures that can be rested and not ploughed up by heavy hooves, and

of course warm horses eat less and do better, despite the lack of paddock exercise.

Back in the day when my family was breeding horses near the southern alps in New Zealand's South Island, we were lucky to be able to bring our weanlings in each night during winter so they could stay warm and dry. I believe that looking after weanlings very well during their first winter gives them a head start going into spring and helps them grow and develop. The daily routine was also incredibly beneficial and stood them in good stead for their future education.

August 1st is almost here – the official birthday of all horses in the Southern Hemisphere! Whether you're celebrating a lively youngster or a wise old friend, it's the perfect excuse to give them an extra treat, a gentle pat, and a little extra love for the joy they bring to our lives.

At Benchmark, our extruded feeds contain **no wheat or mill run**; instead, we use **low-starch**, **highly fermentable fibre** from lupin hulls and extruded barley as the main energy sources.

While this comes at a cost, we believe that it sets our feeds apart from the rest and your horses reap the benefits.
